**Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on  
Sunday 18th March 2018 at 11.15am in the Church Hall**

### **Opening Prayer.**

Dean Jeremy opened the meeting at 11.15am with a prayer. There were 29 people present of whom 27 were on the electoral roll and eligible to vote.

### **Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 5th March 2017 and matters arising.**

It was proposed by Dean Jeremy and seconded by Bill Grundy that the minutes be accepted and it was agreed unanimously. There were no matters arising.

### **Electoral Roll Report.**

It was reported that there are 86 members on the Electoral Roll.

### **Financial Statements for 2017 and Budget for 2018**

Dean Jeremy thanked David Hardacre and Chris Brady who is the cathedral's accountant for all their work in preparing the accounts and the budget.

Slimming World will no longer be using the church hall but the fees for the car park had been raised to 50 euros a week so this will help cover the loss of fees for the hire of the hall.

Carol thanked all who had contributed to the monthly cake sale.

Collections are up but income from the Thrift and Book Shops are down.

Colin Reeves said he would like to apologise for being so despairing of the budget last year.

He also confirmed that any deficit in the accounts is carried forward to the following year.

Friends of St. Paul's has stayed strong, it was explained that this was a legacy from Michael Stone and is used for special projects.

It was proposed by Dean Jeremy and seconded by Colin Reeves that the accounts be accepted. Those in favour 28 against none and one abstention. The motion was carried.

It was proposed by Bill Grundy and seconded by Keith Davies that the budget for 2018 be accepted. Those in favour 28 against none and one abstention.

**Warden's report.**

The wardens presented a joint report and said that they would also like to thank George Ward and Gloria and Keith Davies for the work they do for the cathedral.

**Other report.**

All reports had been circulated apart from the Brownies/Guides, which Dean Jeremy read out. Dean Jeremy encouraged everyone to read all the reports.

Agnette said a vote of thanks should be given to Bill Grundy for all he does for St. George's in the Forest.

**Dean's report.**

Dean Jeremy thank Father Kent, the organists, Bill and Geraldine Grundy, Mac, Nigel the wardens and their deputies for all their help in the past year.

There was a discussion concerning the children not doing the chalice and Dean Jeremy said he would give this some consideration.

Dean Jeremy said that Justin Arnott will be coming to the cathedral as a full time curate.
